## COURSE OUTLINE

### 1. COMMONLY USED FORMAT FOR BUSINESS CHARTS IN EXCEL

- Mapping the right type of chart and subtypes against presented data • The usage and differences between the following charts: Pie and Pie-of pie | Clustered Column | Stacked Bar | Line with markers | 3-D Bubble • Tweaking the chart elements within the various charts above • The need for secondary axes • Changing values within the axes • Handling large against small values within the same data series to prevent an odd-looking chart • Converting sharp edges within charts to a smooth effect without changing the chart type • Dealing with multiple charts within same plot area • Formatting the plot area and bars of charts • Incorporating images within the chart

### 2. UNDERSTANDING CONCEPTS OF INFOGRAPHICS

- The need for infographics • Shapes that can be categorised as rectangles, lines, arrows, etc. • Modifying different layouts • Ability to link data to graphics

### 3. CREATING INFOGRAPHICS WITHIN EXCEL

- Modifying charts and replacing with objects • Creating custom infographics using icons and images • Tweaking of infographics • Changing the look of infographics with different concepts of charts • Comparison of results based on two outcomes e.g. Male vs Female • Portraying infographics for a summary of costing or expenses • Relevance of sorting data before presenting it using infographics • Advantages and disadvantages of using 3-D shapes and objects within infographics • Changing the look of lines to a different effect and style • Fine-tuning final display of infographics

### 4. PRESENTING VISUAL ASPECTS OF CHARTS AND INFOGRAPHICS IN POWERPOINT

- Linking charts and infographics within PowerPoint • Difference between objects and objects as links • Understanding the human elements of presentation • Aligning and presenting objects as charts and infographics as compared to text • Duplicating and formatting objects quickly • Using Slide Master for background images • Presenting the presentation
